Question:

How many data breaches the Yukon government experienced in the last year? I don't know if there is a categorization system of severity. I imagine some of them are quite minor, and some of them, I know, are quite severe. If he is able to break it down — if there is a categorization system or describe the distribution of them a little bit — that would be great.

Response:

Between April 1, 2022, and March 31, 2023, there were 113 privacy breaches reported to the Designated Privacy Officers of 19 public bodies. There were 15 privacy breaches reported as having risk of significant harm to individuals which resulted in providing a copy of the privacy breach report to the Information and Privacy Commissioner, as required by the Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act (ATIPP). Breaches that are determined to pose a significant risk of harm are reported immediately upon making that determination, in accordance with ATIPP.
