The response is as follows:

Question:

A brushing job started between Johnsons Crossing and Lone Tree Creek. Some guys came in from Fort Nelson, did one pass up one side and down the other, and left the country and never came back. I have asked — there never appeared to be a contract for it. It was an add-on to a contract that was done the previous year from Marsh Lake to Johnsons Crossing.

I am curious if there is any update at all as to when brushing may occur between Johnsons Crossing and Lone Tree Creek.

Response:

In 2021, Highways and Public Works issued a contract for brushing from kilometer 1264 to 1295. The work was incomplete and unsatisfactory, so the contract was cancelled.

In 2022, it was expected there would be a contract for brushing from kilometer 1264 to 1295, however bids were higher than anticipated and the tender was cancelled.

This section is top priority for 2024, and a detailed site-specific estimate is underway to ensure the work is budgeted for and completed.
