- 1. How much is spent now on external printing contracts that have replaced the Queen's or King's Printer? (Amount spent on external contracts for printing across government).
- 2. Have they tracked wait times, for example, for external printing contracts compared to the wait times when it was a central agency?

## Response:

- 1. The printing expenditures over the past eight years, based on contracts with four local print businesses, are as follows:
  - 2016-17: \$328, 275
  - 2017-18: \$220,321
  - 2018-19: \$292,525
  - 2019-20: \$220,285 (closure of Queen's Printer Agency)
  - 2020-21: \$233,829
  - 2021-22: \$258,401
  - 2022-23: \$306,295
  - 2023-24: \$178,234 to date

The Yukon government has gone more digital in recent years.

2. Wait times are not tracked. However, each job is set with a delivery timeline to be met by the printer.
