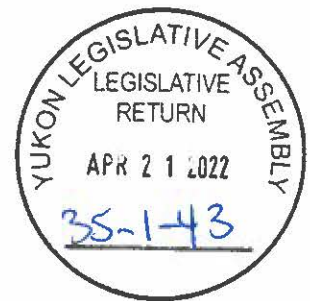

The response is as follows:

Ms. Van Bibber asked the following question in response to the Ministerial Statement:

“Can the minister provide clarity on the ArriveCAN app and if Yukoners will need to use it for trips to Alaska, for example, during a day trip to Skagway?”

- The ArriveCan app remains an important line of defense at the international border while the pandemic continues, especially since COVID-19 testing before entry is no longer a requirement for fully vaccinated individuals.
- Our government has worked successfully with partners and our federal counterparts to advocate for the end of random mandatory COVID-19 testing, in order to avoid delays for individuals entering the Yukon through our international borders, including returning Yukoners.
- Currently, Yukoners taking short trips to Alaska must continue to use the ArriveCan app and upload their information within 72 hours of re-entry to Canada. Failure to do so could result in additional delays at the border for public health questioning and may also result in fines or enforcement action.
- In some limited exceptions, individuals can use an alternative to ArriveCAN, such as:
 - Persons with accessibility needs (based on World Health Organization’s definition);
 - A service disruption or a natural disaster.
