The response is as follows:

Thank you for your questions on October 12, 2022, regarding the Kêts'ádañ Kù project. In coordination with the Minister of Highways and Public Works, I am writing to share some answers to those questions, as I comitted in the Legislature.

Q. How [will] the design and construction will play out? Is the design work underway? What are the tendering and construction timelines?

A. The design is currently at the conceptual phase. We do not have a definitive date on the tender of the project at this time. The tender and project completion date will be confirmed subject to additional project planning.

We expect to begin clearing and grubbing, and possibly some earthworks for the road and parking lot in 2023, under the Yukon Asset Construction Agreement. The construction of the building is anticipated to start in the summer of 2024.

Q. Will the government meet with the residents of Destruction Bay to gather input about the future of the old Kluane Lake School?

A. The building is in relatively good structural condition. Highways and Public Works will continue dialogue on future use of the old school and site with the community.

Q. Does the government already have plans on what the old school should be used for? Does the government plan on tearing down this school, or will they renovate and repurpose the old school? Has money been set aside to deal with the old Kluane Lake School?

A. There is no plan in place yet for the existing school. Highways and Public Works will complete a use assessment of the Kluane Lake School in Destruction Bay to help determine the future of the facility. All options, including demolition will be under consideration.

Thank you again for your questions on the Kets'ádañ Ku` project, which will ensure students in Burwash have access to a modern learning facility for years to come.
