FIRST REPORT

On March 9, 1977, the Yukon Legislative Assembly ordered

"THAT a Standing Committee on Statutory
Instruments be established to review all
regulations as they are published.

THAT Messrs. Fleming, McCall and Berger be
appointed to the said Committee.

THAT the Committee have the power to report
from time to time; to call for persons,
papers and records; to print such papers
and documents as may be ordered by the
Committee; to arrange for verbatim
transcripts; and to sit during the inter-
sessional periods.

THAT the Clerk of Assembly be responsible
for providing the necessary support staff
to the said Committee."


On March 17, 1977, the Yukon Legislative Assembly ordered

"THAT a draft paper entitled "Recreation
Grants Regulations" be referred to the
Standing Committee on Statutory
Instruments for review and report back
to this House on or before March 22,
1977."

Your Committee is to ensure that statutory instruments are authorized by the Ordinance pursuant to which they are made and that such instruments do not constitute an unusual or unexpected use of the authority. Bill #12, Recreation Development Ordinance, is currently before this House for consideration. Your Committee, not having a statute base from which to work, finds itself unable to determine whether the Recreation Grants Regulations are either "ultra vires" or "intra vires" of its parent legislation.

Your Committee, therefore, recommends that upon Royal Assent being given to the Recreation Development Ordinance any regulations made pursuant to the said Ordinance be examined by your Standing Committee on Statutory Instruments.
