

## Answer:

Micro-generation program production annual payouts and renewable energy rebates are as follows:

Fiscal year Micro-generation program production reimbursement total

2014/15 \$1,643.34

2015/16 \$3,739.11

2016/17 \$17,801.76

2017/18 \$58,200.00 This sum is not yet paid out, as reimbursements are made at the end of the fiscal year.

Total reimbursements for the micro-generation program, to the end of fiscal year 2017/18, will be \$81,384.21.

Fiscal year Renewable energy rebates by program year 2014/15 \$11,717 2015/16 \$41,581 2016/17 \$139,777 2017/18 \$317,640
