The response is as follows:

The issue of mental wellness was clearly top of mind for most community residents when I met with them last June. Since that time, my staff have been focused on providing the right supports at the right time in each community.

Watson Lake is one of four hubs within Yukon to provide a range of counselling and pre and post care for substance use. We know this is an important need for the community. The other hubs will be in Haines Junction, Dawson City and Carmacks, as well as services in Whitehorse.

The Watson Lake Mental Wellness and Substance Use hub will officially open on Friday, March 23, 2018. A small opening ceremony and open house are planned for the day, beginning at 1:30 p.m. at the recreational centre.

The Watson Lake Hub will provide services to Watson Lake residents, and specialist services to Teslin and Carcross/Tagish. In Teslin and Carcross, there will also be individual counsellors who will be providing support including mental wellness counsellors, child and youth counsellors, and Many Rivers who are currently providing supports in these two communities on an itinerant basis.

Over the last two years, we had added an additional substance use counsellor in Watson Lake.

With the new hub, we can now provide a one-door access to services for children and youth who have experienced trauma, mental wellness and mental wellness supports as well as pre and post care related to substance use.

There is a 1-800- number for people wishing to make an appointment or people can drop into the office. We have reduced waiting lists for services from several months down to a week.

With the new hub model we will be providing individual counselling, outreach services, community supports when crisis in community as well as coordination of services when a person requires inpatient treatment in Whitehorse through Sarah Steele or Whitehorse General Hospital.

We will be working very closely to coordinate supports with Many Rivers and school counsellors within the school communities. This is a free confidential service focussed on the needs of the individual and will grow over time.

We have brought together a team of specialists who can support the services in Watson Lake but also Teslin and Carcross.
