

Bill No. 210 - First Appropriation Act 2019-20 – Committee of the Whole – Vote 12

On Thursday, March 21, 2019, at 4032 page(s) of *Hansard*.

Ms. Hanson: I am definitely not speaking of federal transfers. I am speaking of revenues that we, as a government — efforts made by Yukon government. If you want to refer to it as own-source revenue, then yes — of GDP, not of the percentage. I know what the comparison is in terms of how much we generate versus what we get from the federal government, but I am looking at it as a percentage of our GDP.

Hon. Mr. Silver: We have the same information that the member opposite has, which is the percentage of total revenues. We could do a quick calculation of the GDP number in total and divide that by the number of own-source revenue, but we don't have that number readily available. We will give that number to the member opposite when we get that calculation.

The response is as follows:

- As of the most recent public accounts, total expenses net of recoveries as a share of GDP was 44% in 2017-18 and is expected to fall to 39% by 2021-22.
- Own source revenue as a share of GDP was 5.4% in 2017-18. This ratio is more or less stable over the forecast.
- Taking fiscal indicators as a share of GDP can be a useful means of putting large numbers in perspective, but they should not be interpreted as a contribution to the economy, which will depend on how the money is spent.
 - For example, if the government buys goods from a company in Alberta, that will increase government spending, but have no impact on Yukon's GDP.
