The response is as follows:

The Government of Yukon works on an ongoing basis to fill and address vacancies in schools and to ensure that there are consistent service levels across schools.

As of November 20, 2019, there are 14 vacant teacher positions in Yukon schools. 13 of these are vacant due to retirements, resignations, or absences this year due to leave, secondments, etc. 1 is a vacant temporary position.

The schools with vacant teacher positions include:

1. In Carmacks: Tantalus Community School (1)
2. In Dawson City: Robert Service School (1)
3. In Haines Junction: St. Elias Community School (1)
4. In Mayo: J.V. Clark School (2)
5. In Ross River: Ross River School (1)
6. In Watson Lake: Johnson Elementary School (1)
7. In Whitehorse:
 - Aurora Virtual School (1)
 - Chris the King Elementary (1)
 - FH Collins Secondary (2 vacancies; 1 is temporary)
 - Porter Creek Secondary (1)
 - Selkirk Elementary (1)
 - Wood Street Centre (1)

Teachers on Call may be used in the short-term to fill vacancies of less than 30 days. Teachers on Call from Whitehorse may fill in at rural schools if there are no Teachers on Call available in the community.
