

Questions:

What locations are being considered for the new campground?

Is there any money in this year's budget for the new campground?

The strategy contemplates adding sites to existing campgrounds. Have they made a decision on which existing campgrounds would be expected to see new sites added?

The strategy contemplates new boat-in or hike-in sites. Can the Minister tell us where those will be?

The response is as follows:

In September 2020, the Department of Environment announced the Yukon Parks Strategy – a ten year strategy that sets the long-term direction for Yukon's system of parks and campgrounds. We are in the early stages of identifying possible locations for a new campground within two hours of Whitehorse. As such, there are no specific locations being considered quite yet.


There is no additional money in this year's budget specifically allocated to the new campground. Work on this project within this fiscal year can be accomplished within existing resources. Over a three year period starting in 2022-23, approximately \$2.3 million has been identified in the capital budget for the development of a new recreation park and campground.

Locations of where we will be adding campsites to the existing campgrounds is not yet known. Decisions on this will occur incrementally over the next five years guided by visitor demands, operational opportunities and constraints, and the establishment of a new parks system plan. Opportunities for campground expansion may also be explored through dialogue with First Nations. This systematic approach to determining the location of expansion sites will also depend on the size and location of the new campground.
