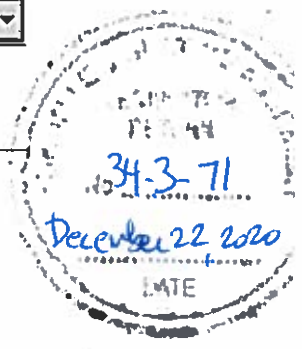

The response is as follows:  
Over the past five years, the department has consistently allocated over \$1 million annually to support wildlife inventory and monitoring. This includes the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

The Department of Environment works collaboratively with First Nation governments, Inuvialuit, neighbouring governments, as well as non-governmental boards, councils and committees - such as Renewable Resources Councils, hunters, trappers, outfitting industry, and citizens out on the land - to monitor Yukon species.

This work informs decisions on harvest management, land-use planning and environmental assessment processes.
