The response is as follows:

Yukon Energy only uses rental diesel during the winter months to provide reliable service to customers in case of an emergency and during peak demands for electricity.

Between January 1, 2020 and April 30, 2020, approximately 1.9 million litres of diesel was used for the rental diesels.

Yukon Energy's existing contract for the rental units this heating season began on December 1, 2020. Information about how much diesel these units have used between December 1, 2020 and now is not available at this time.

The 1.9 million litres referenced into today's Return differs from the information provided by Mr. Hall on December 15, 2020 because the 2.1 million litres referred to on December 15 by Mr. Hall was based on the estimates used to calculate fuel consumption in order to respond to ATIPP requests A-8544 and A-8543.

As highlighted in Note 1 of Yukon Energy's response to those ATIPPs, " Yukon Energy did not have the systems in place to track fuel consumption by rental unit. The amounts reported are a mix of volume estimates based on purchases and month end dips and proxy estimates based on generation and assumed efficiency."
