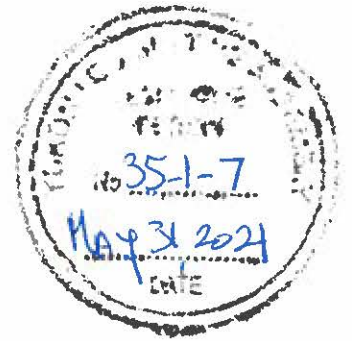


LEGISLATIVE RETURN

The response is as follows:

All inmates at the Whitehorse Correctional Centre (WCC) are provided with an Individualized Care Plan that is tailored to their specific needs and may include referrals to other service providers such as FASSY, Challenge Disability Group, and the Department of Health and Social Services.

Assessments for Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Disorder (FASD) are completed by staff within the Department of Health and Social Services based on referrals from health care staff at the Whitehorse Correctional Centre.

Over the course of the last year, the Whitehorse Correctional Centre has not referred any individuals for an FASD assessment. Individuals who are engaged with FASSY or other service providers prior to their incarceration are encouraged by the Whitehorse Correctional Centre staff to maintain these connections while incarcerated. The Whitehorse Correctional Centre client's access to professional visits, including those provided by service agencies or NGOs have not been restricted and have been available to inmates at the Whitehorse Correctional Centre throughout the duration of COVID-19.
