THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to conduct air quality tests of the new Carmacks school and that the results be released to the public prior to children and staff taking occupancy of the facility.

2. Mr. McRobb (Motion #139)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to abide by its election promises and follow its own objectives with respect to contracting policy and benefits to Yukoners by scaling contracts to encourage bids from Yukon contractors instead of issuing high-scaled contract tenders of unprecedented proportion in the territory, as it did with contract number FMB-07-001, in order that local forestry contractors not be disqualified from the bidding process.
