GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #169)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, through the Department of Community Services, to establish an Infrastructure Fund to address the immediate infrastructure needs of Yukon communities.

4. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #170)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to utilize the review of social assistance rates currently underway to increase social assistance rates for those in need, and to provide incentives for those on social assistance who want to enter the work force.

5. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

6. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #233)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to recognize that the unilateral decision in 1966 to integrate the Canadian Forces Superannuation and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation with the Canada Pension Plan contributions imposed an injustice and unfairness upon members and retirees of the Canadian Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and therefore should take action to remedy that injustice.

7. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:

- (1) further assist Yukoners who wish to quit smoking by funding a portion of the cost of nicotine replacement therapies; and
- (2) work in partnership with the Motor Vehicles Branch to provide drivers with information on the increased health impacts of smoking within the confined space of a motor vehicle.

NOTICES OF MOTION MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. McRobb (Motion #415)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to encourage the development of bioenergy in our Territory, with the goal of making our entire forestry industry, the first Canadian jurisdiction to be classified as carbon-neutral, by taking immediate action that includes the issuance of a Request for Proposals for such projects to make practical use of beetle-killed forests, as the Government of British Columbia has already done.

2. Mr. McRobb (Motion #416)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to introduce amendments to the *Public Service Act* to apply the conflict of interest guidelines for deputy ministers to the heads of government corporations and agencies, including both the positions of chair and president.

3. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #417)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to work with the Federal Government to allocate emergency funds to provide counselling and other support services, such as financial planning advice, to claimants going through the residential school compensation process.

4. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #418)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Economic Development to work closely with the Town of Faro, as well as with representatives of industry, labour, First Nations governments, the Government of Canada, Yukon College, the receiver for the former Anvil Range mining properties, and other interested parties, in order to assist the people of Faro to achieve their goal of sustainable economic development through such initiatives as a centre of excellence for mining reclamation and an integrated industrial training centre to make best use of the abandoned mine-sites in the Faro area.

5. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #419)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to develop and implement a public education campaign about comprehensive land use planning and how it works, so that people in all areas of Yukon are able to participate knowledgeably in the process of defining how Yukon lands and resources can best be used for the benefit of current and future generations.
