GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #169)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, through the Department of Community Services, to establish an Infrastructure Fund to address the immediate infrastructure needs of Yukon communities.

4. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #170)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to utilize the review of social assistance rates currently underway to increase social assistance rates for those in need, and to provide incentives for those on social assistance who want to enter the work force.

5. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:

- (1) further assist Yukoners who wish to quit smoking by funding a portion of the cost of nicotine replacement therapies; and

NOTICES OF MOTION MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #452)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Health to ensure employees and the public are informed of unsafe working conditions by publicly releasing all reports pertaining to worker health and safety in a timely fashion.

2. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #453)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Community Services to work with the people of Tagish, and any other community where the burning of garbage is a common practice, to modernize their waste management facilities immediately so that the practice of burning garbage can be ended throughout rural Yukon, in the interests of protecting our environmental health.

3. Mr. Hardy (Motion #454)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to recognize the plight of the Burmese people affected by the recent cyclone by making a generous donation of financial or other aid assistance, and to consider directing such aid through the Internationals Burmese Monks Organization as an alternative to the Canadian International Development Agency.

4. Mr. Hardy (Motion #455)

THAT this House urges the Premier to indicate before the end of the 2008 Spring Sitting of the Legislative Assembly what the Government's intentions are with regard to the Trade, Investment and Labour Mobility Agreement that currently exists between the provinces of Alberta and British Columbia, and to outline his plans for public and legislative debate in the event the Yukon Government decides to participate in such an agreement with any other Canadian jurisdiction.

5. Mr. Hardy (Motion #456)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to extend the period of public consultation on the proposed Species at Risk Act beyond the current July 11 deadline, so that Yukoners have adequate time to review the draft legislation and comment on what species should be listed as being at risk and what protection measures should be put in place.
