#### **GOVERNMENT MOTIONS**

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #169)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, through the Department of Community Services, to establish an Infrastructure Fund to address the immediate infrastructure needs of Yukon communities.

4. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #170)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to utilize the review of social assistance rates currently underway to increase social assistance rates for those in need, and to provide incentives for those on social assistance who want to enter the work force.

5. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

- (3) how long is the project involving people with disabilities who look after the Government's document shredding and recycling scheduled to run, and what plans are there to provide opportunities for people with disabilities in the public service,
- (4) why has the Public Service Commission taken the position that the right to join unions doesn't extend to certain categories, such as teachers-on-call and emergency fire-fighters,
- (5) is the Minister prepared to re-visit that position for example, if teachers-on-call make another attempt at union certification,
- (6) how many grievances are currently on the books, and what is being done to clear up any backlog? (WQ#9)

# NOTICES OF MOTION GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #457)

THAT, pursuant to section 18 of the *Conflict of Interest (Members and Ministers) Act*, the Legislative Assembly reappoint David Phillip Jones, Q.C., as a member of the Conflict of Interest Commission for a three-year period.

#### MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #458)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to undertake a two year pilot project in conjunction with the City of Whitehorse to offer free public bus transportation to all residents of the city with upgraded and more frequent routes so that residents can:

- (1) reduce the harmful carbon emissions and thus make a very significant reduction in global warming,
- (2) reduce their dependence on high priced gasoline and diesel fuel; and
- (3) assist their families with their transportation needs by possibly reducing their dependence on having to have a second vehicle.
- 2. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #459)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to undertake a review of ways of preventing the controversial drink "Blow", which is sold as a white powder, is packaged with a mirror and a credit card and contains 240 milligrams of caffeine and uses the street slang for cocaine and has packaging which resembles drug paraphernalia from being sold in Yukon.

3. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #460)

THAT this House urges the Premier of Yukon to write to the federal Treasury Board President and ask him to reinstate the Co-ordination of Access to Information Requests Systems (CAIRS) and to update the laws and institutions that ensure that people have reasonable access to government information in the interests of strengthening our democracy.

4. Mr. Hardy (Motion #461)

THAT this House extend the 2008 Spring Sitting of the Legislative Assembly until at least May 22, to give Members more opportunity to attend to important public business, including completing their review of the 2008-2009 Main Estimates and other outstanding matters, such as the proposed amendments to the *Liquor Act*, as well as conducting detailed scrutiny of the Yukon Government's long-awaited Climate Change Action Plan.

5. Mr. Hardy (Motion #462)

THAT this House urges the Chair of the Public Accounts Committee to schedule a meeting of the Committee before the end of the 2008 Spring Sitting for the purpose of determining areas of Government spending and financial management that should be subject to scrutiny by the Committee over the next year, including such subjects as the delays and cost overruns associated with the Watson Lake health facility, the follow-up by the Department of Highways and Public Works to the Auditor General's report on the operations of that department, and the long-term implications of the Yukon Government's recent investment practices.
