GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #169)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, through the Department of Community Services, to establish an Infrastructure Fund to address the immediate infrastructure needs of Yukon communities.

4. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #170)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to utilize the review of social assistance rates currently underway to increase social assistance rates for those in need, and to provide incentives for those on social assistance who want to enter the work force.

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

1. Mr. Fairclough (Motion #467)
THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to provide more housing in the communities to accommodate teachers and other eligible Yukon Government employees with adequate housing and to upgrade existing housing to acceptable standards so that present and potential employees will find living conditions more attractive.
2. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #468)
THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to develop and establish experiential courses on human rights legislation and issues for study in all public schools.
3. Mr. Hardy (Motion #469)
THAT Standing Order 11(2) of the Yukon Legislative Assembly, be amended to add a provision to the Daily Routine for Members' Statements not exceeding four minutes each, immediately following the Ministerial Statement and before Oral Question Period.
4. Mr. Hardy (Motion #470)
THAT Standing Order 20(1) be amended to read as follows:
"Unless otherwise provided for in these Standing Orders, when the Speaker is in the Chair, no Member may speak for more than ten minutes, with the exception of the mover of a motion and one member from each other party in the Legislative Assembly, speaking in reply immediately thereafter, who may each speak for no more than twenty minutes."

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to develop creative solutions to lessen our reliance on the transportation of food from the south and increase local food security, including extending the Master Gardener program to every community in the Yukon and introducing school gardens and agricultural curriculum in our schools so that our children are taught how to grow their own food.
