## **ORDERS OF THE DAY**

## **GOVERNMENT MOTIONS**

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

4. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and nongovernmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:

- (2) does the Government believe it is on-track with respect to recruitment and succession planning, and that we will have enough well-trained employees to maintain excellent public services as the current employees reach retirement age,
- (3) how long is the project involving people with disabilities who look after the Government's document shredding and recycling scheduled to run, and what plans are there to provide opportunities for people with disabilities in the public service,
- (4) why has the Public Service Commission taken the position that the right to join unions doesn't extend to certain categories, such as teachers-on-call and emergency fire-fighters,
- (5) is the Minister prepared to re-visit that position for example, if teachers-on-call make another attempt at union certification,
- (6) how many grievances are currently on the books, and what is being done to clear up any backlog? (WQ#9)

## NOTICES OF MOTION MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. McRobb (Motion #480)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to stop dragging its feet on the promised legislative renewal process and to work with all Members of this Assembly and the Yukon public towards making their legislature more productive, accountable and fair to all.

2. Mr. Elias (Motion #481)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to inform and educate business on the new *Smoke-free Places Act,* as it takes effect today by:

- (1) making the Act and Regulations publicly and easily accessible,
- (2) mailing out the Act and Regulations to all affected businesses; and
- (3) informing businesses with an education campaign that consists of radio ads, newspaper ads, television ads and mail outs.
- 3. Mr. Inverarity (Motion #482)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to review the *Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act* and bring forward amendments in the 2008 Fall Sitting that:

- (1) include provisions to ensure that appropriate intervention can be applied when criminal activity resumes at a location previously known to the SCAN program and where such criminal activity has been previously stopped as a result of actions taken by the SCAN program; and
- (2) ensure that neighbourhood residents are not required to file a new complaint about preexisting criminal activity.

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to live up to section 7(1), (2), and (3) of the *Health Act*, and

THAT the Minister of Health and Social Services demonstrate that the amount of four million, one hundred and eighty-seven thousand, eight hundred dollars, which is the amount of five per cent of health treatment in the current budget, is allocated for preventative health and health promotion programs and services.

5. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #485)

THAT this House urges the Standing Committee on Appointments to Major Government Boards and Committees to convene immediately with the purpose of addressing the number of vacancies on important Yukon Boards and Committees.

6. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #486)

THAT this House urges the Standing Committee on Rules, Elections and Privileges to convene immediately for the purpose of developing recommendations to improve the conduct of the public's business in the Yukon Legislative Assembly, including, but not limited to such recommendations as:

- (1) the elimination of Standing Orders 75 and 76,
- (2) making provision for Members' Statements in the Daily Routine,

- (3) the allocation of time limits on speeches and replies during days with Private Members' Business has precedence and in departmental budget debate,
- (4) the allocation of overall time limits for debating individual motions,
- (5) equal representation on all Standing, Select and Special Committees of the Legislative Assembly,
- (6) provisions to increase opportunities for members of the public to appear as witnesses or to make presentations about matters before the Legislative Assembly,
- (7) amendments empowering the Speaker to rule against evasive or irrelevant responses during Oral Question Period,
- (8) the establishment of a Code of Ethics for Members of the Legislative Assembly,
- (9) the establishment of fixed dates for the commencement of the Spring and Fall Sittings; and
- (10) any other changes gleaned from the best practices found in other Legislatures.

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to strike an all-party committee to establish criteria for donating public funds to international emergency relief efforts to ensure the process is fair, timely and appropriate.

8. Mr. Hardy (Motion #490)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to encourage the Federal Government to prohibit the trade of food staples such as rice and flour as commodities on the speculative exchange markets.
