MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #590)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to:

- (1) improve spending accountability on all capital projects currently under way and on those still in the planning process; and
- (2) explain the:
 - a) evaluation process used for the feasibility and priority of various large capital projects,
 - b) justification for which communities are receiving capital projects,
 - c) justification for the difference between original contracted bid amounts and actual costs on many projects,
 - d) justification of sole sourced contracts on some projects and how this saves money;
 - e) guidelines used in determining when a project is deemed to be completed within budgeted amount.
- 2. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #477)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to hold public consultations to review the Landlord and Tenant Act, and in the amendments, to provide for:

- (1) enforcement of minimum housing and health standards,
- (2) clarification on the relationship between the Act and the Public Health and Safety Act,
- (3) establishment of a formal hearing process for evictions,

- (4) a mediation process for conflicts between landlords and tenants,
- (5) protection of tenants who complain about their housing;; and
- (6) re-drafting of the whole Act in plain language.
- 3. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #41)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to develop and implement, as an urgent priority, an effective territory-wide Anti-Poverty Action Plan that will identify and correct the root causes of poverty in the Yukon and will make the need for food banks and soup kitchens in one of the most privileged societies in the world a shameful relic of the past.

4. Mr. McRobb (Motion #150)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to live up to its commitment to be an open and accountable government and uphold the tradition of this House by not refusing to respond to the essence of questions during Question Period.

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

4. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

(1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,

- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:

- (1) further assist Yukoners who wish to quit smoking by funding a portion of the cost of nicotine replacement therapies; and

1. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #595)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to work with the Youth of Today Society, First Nation Governments, non-government organizations and other interested stakeholders to support Angel's Nest Shelter with funding to provide a safe environment with a personal support system for youth at risk to go to this winter.

2. Mr. Inverarity (Motion #596)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to investigate the significant discrepancy between the retail cost of gasoline and the retail cost of home heating oil and report back to the Legislative Assembly at the earliest opportunity.
