GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

4. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

(1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as

apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,

- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:

- (1) further assist Yukoners who wish to quit smoking by funding a portion of the cost of nicotine replacement therapies; and

1. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #614)

That this House urges the Government of Yukon to immediately bring forth an economic action plan so that:

- (1) the Yukon economy will not suffer unduly during the current global recession,
- (2) Yukon contractors, skilled trades people and other workers can continue to find employment in Yukon in the coming months; and
- (3) Yukoners can feel some sense of optimism about their economic future and not further restrict their spending thus adding to the downturn.

2. Mr. McRobb (Motion #615)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to draft legislation that ensures that health professionals work to their full scope of competencies by:

- (2) reviewing current trends in other jurisdictions to assess their applicability in Yukon; and,
- (3) bringing forward nurse practitioner legislation that defines and supports nurse practitioners working in Yukon as soon as possible.

4. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #617)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government, by consulting with all health care professional associations, to encourage, develop, and support a collaborative primary health care delivery model in order to ensure better and accelerated access to primary care in a more cost effective manner.
