ORDERS OF THE DAY

GOVERNMENT PRIVATE MEMBERS' BUSINESS

1. Mr. Nordick (Motion #702)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to present the business case entitled "<u>Healthy People Strong North: A Case for the Continued and Enhanced Strategic Investment in the Health Care Systems of the Territories</u>" to the Government of Canada for the continuation or replacement of funds, such as the Territorial Health Access Fund, which are designed to meet the unique health care needs and challenges of the North.

2. Mr. Nordick (Motion #691)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to proceed with the implementation of a number of priority initiatives identified in the Corrections Action Plan, some of which include:

- (1) the implementation of correctional reform through the ongoing operations of the Corrections Action Plan Implementation Office,
- (2) passage and implementation of the new Yukon Corrections Act, 2009 based on principles which provide for the rehabilitation, healing and reintegration of offenders into society,
- (3) the construction of a new Correctional Centre built in conjunction with a new Treatment Centre,
- (4) the implementation of the enhanced direct supervision model in the operation of the new Correctional Centre including human resource development and training for staff such as the Correctional Office Living Unit Training Model,

- (5) the construction of the Women's Transition Living Unit to meet the immediate needs of female inmates,
- (6) the operation of therapeutic courts such as the Community Wellness Court and the Domestic Violence Treatment Options Court,
- (7) work with First Nation governments, communities and NGO's to provide access to land-based camps/treatment centres for inmates of the Whitehorse Correctional Centre and offenders supervised in the community,
- (8) the continued implementation of the 5-Step FASD Action Plan,
- (9) the continued implementation of the Substance Abuse Action Plan which emphasizes harm reduction, prevention and education, treatment and enforcement; and
- (10) the enhancement of enforcement measures through the continued operation of the *Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act* and the RCMP Street Crime Reduction Team.

GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

4. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

5. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #357)

THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:

- (1) further assist Yukoners who wish to quit smoking by funding a portion of the cost of nicotine replacement therapies; and
- (2) work in partnership with the Motor Vehicles Branch to provide drivers with information on the increased health impacts of smoking within the confined space of a motor vehicle.
