GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

4. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #713)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada and its NATO allies to insist in the strongest possible terms that the Government of Afghanistan fully honour its human rights treaty obligations under international laws and demonstrate its commitment both in law and in practice to respect, protect and enforce the equality rights of the women of Afghanistan or face international sanctions.

5. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #723)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to support the findings of the Motion #542 Consultation Report done by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board, responding to Motion #542 adopted during the 2008 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, by requesting that the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board:

- (1) work together within their existing frameworks of authority to appropriately address areas of general consensus;
- (2) work together to ensure adequate training, orientation and supervision of young workers; and
- (3) conduct a review within 5 years to assess the effectiveness of any regulations resulting from this consultation and consider whether there is a need for a general minimum working age in Yukon.

6. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #831)

THAT this House urges one member of the Official Opposition Caucus, one member of the Third Party Caucus and the Independent Member to accept the Yukon Government's invitation to attend the Climate Leaders Summit at COP15 in Copenhagen, Denmark, as observers from December 13-20, 2009.

7. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #832)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explore the concept of a multidisciplinary approach to dealing with the complex needs of chronic substance abusers.

GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #857)

THAT the membership of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts as established by Motion #8 of the First Session of the 32nd Legislative Assembly be amended by rescinding the appointment of John Edzerza and appointing Steve Cardiff to the Committee.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #854)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to provide stable and long-term funding to the Whitehorse Food Bank to ensure the Whitehorse Food Bank does not have to rely solely upon volunteer contributions to finance its operations.

2. Mr. Elias (Motion #855)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to introduce amendments to the *Municipal Act* to provide greater protections for person privacy by allowing electors, when being enumerated, to withdraw their names from publicly posted lists of electors.

3. Mr. Elias (Motion #856)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to formally recognize elder Stephen Frost Sr. of Old Crow, Yukon, for his 37 years of service and dedication to the operation and maintenance of the Old Crow Nursing Station by renaming the "Old Crow Health Centre" the Stephen Frost Sr. Health Centre".

4. Mr. Fairclough (Motion #858)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to provide a Ministerial Statement updating Yukoners on the status of H1N1 in the Territory.

5. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #859)

THAT this House urges the Legislative Assembly's Standing Committee on Public Accounts to exercise its rights and obligations by issuing subpoenas, if necessary, to call Yukon Government officials, Yukon Government Ministers, current and former directors of the Yukon Energy Corporation, members of the Yukon public and executives of ATCO as witnesses to appear before the Committee to answer questions on discussions between ATCO and the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources and the Yukon Energy Corporation regarding the management, generation, distribution and ownership of the Yukon's energy assets.

6. Mr. Hardy (Motion #860)

THAT this House supports the initiative of Bruce Hyder, NDP Member of Parliament for Thunder Bay-Superior North in drafting Bill C-311, the Climate Change Accountability Act, which would establish science-based targets for greenhouse gas emissions reductions, and encourages the Parliament of Canada to pass this bill into law before the Copenhagen Climate Change Conference commences on December 7.

7. Mr. Cathers (Motion #861)

THAT this House urges the Department of Highways and Public Works to examine and report on options to improve safety at the Takhini River Bridge on the North Klondike Highway, including improving the approach to the bridge, widening the bridge, and adding a pedestrian walkway.

8. Mr. Cathers (Motion #862)

THAT this House urges all Members of Parliament and Senators to support Bill C-391, An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Firearms Act (repeal of long-gun registry).
