1. Mr. Hardy (Motion #852)

THAT a Select Committee on Bill 108, Legislative Renewal Act, be established,

THAT the membership of the Committee be comprised of equal representation from the Government caucus, the Official Opposition caucus and the Third Party caucus to be determined by the Premier, the Leader of the Official Opposition and the Leader of the Third Party,

THAT the Committee conduct public consultations for the purpose of receiving the views and opinions of Yukon citizens and interested groups on the Act,

THAT the Committee report to the House its findings and recommendations no later than the 2010 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly,

THAT the Government introduce in the House legislation no later than the 2010 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly,

THAT the Committee have the power to call for persons, papers and records and to sit during inter-sessional periods,

THAT the Committee have the power to seek background information from experts and to be able to call and hear these experts as witnesses,

THAT if the House is not sitting at such time as the Committee is prepared to present its report, the Committee transmit its report to all Members of the Legislative Assembly, and then, not more than one day later, release the report to the public; and

THAT the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly be responsible for providing the necessary support services to the Committee.

GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.
- 4. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #713)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada and its NATO allies to insist in the strongest possible terms that the Government of Afghanistan fully honour its human rights treaty obligations under international laws and demonstrate its commitment both in law and in practice to respect, protect and enforce the equality rights of the women of Afghanistan or face international sanctions.

5. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #723)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to support the findings of the Motion #542 Consultation Report done by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board, responding to Motion #542 adopted during the 2008 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, by requesting that the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board:

- (1) work together within their existing frameworks of authority to appropriately address areas of general consensus;
- (2) work together to ensure adequate training, orientation and supervision of young workers; and
- (3) conduct a review within 5 years to assess the effectiveness of any regulations resulting from this consultation and consider whether there is a need for a general minimum working age in Yukon.
- 6. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #831)

THAT this House urges one member of the Official Opposition Caucus, one member of the Third Party Caucus and the Independent Member to accept the Yukon Government's invitation to attend the Climate Leaders Summit at COP15 in Copenhagen, Denmark, as observers from December 13-20, 2009.

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explore the concept of a multidisciplinary approach to dealing with the complex needs of chronic substance abusers.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Nordick (Motion #863)

THAT this House urges all Yukoners to celebrate the arrival of the Olympic Torch in Yukon and to seize the Olympic spirit of fair play, respect, commitment for peace and the power of sport by participating in the Olympic Torch Relay events taking place in Yukon communities November 3 and 4, 2009.

2. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #864)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support the initiative of Nathan Cullen, New Democrat Member of Parliament, in drafting Bill C-472, An Act to Amend the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act, in order to establish the Civilian Investigation Service which would investigate the circumstances surrounding the death of, or the occurrence of serious bodily harm, to any person while that person was in the custody of the RCMP.

3. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #865)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support the initiative of Jim Maloway, New Democrat Member of Parliament, in drafting Bill C-310, An Act to Provide Certain Rights to Air Passengers, in order to place obligations on air carriers to provide compensation and other assistance to passengers in certain cases, such as when:

- (1) a flight has been cancelled or delayed,
- (2) boarding has been denied, or
- (3) an aircraft has remained on the ground for a period of more than an hour at an airport, and to require air carriers to disclose all relevant information to the public regarding the pricing of flights and to keep passengers informed regarding any misplaced baggage and developments in respect of their flights that could have a significant impact on their travel plans.

MOTION FOR THE PRODUCTION OF PAPERS

THAT this House do issue an order for all documents and papers related to the Memorandum of Understanding that the Government of Yukon has been negotiating with the ATCO Group since November of 2008, including:

- (1) the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Yukon and the Nacho Nyak Dun First Nation on the Mayo B hydro-electric project,
- (2) the Contribution Agreement between the Government of Yukon and the Government of Canada on the Mayo B hydro-electric project; and

THAT all these documents be tabled in the Legislative Assembly prior to the next meeting of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts.
