GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

4. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #713)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada and its NATO allies to insist in the strongest possible terms that the Government of Afghanistan fully honour its human rights treaty obligations under international laws and demonstrate its commitment both in law and in practice to respect, protect and enforce the equality rights of the women of Afghanistan or face international sanctions.

5. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #723)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to support the findings of the Motion #542 Consultation Report done by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board, responding to Motion #542 adopted during the 2008 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, by requesting that the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board:

- (1) work together within their existing frameworks of authority to appropriately address areas of general consensus;
- (2) work together to ensure adequate training, orientation and supervision of young workers; and
- (3) conduct a review within 5 years to assess the effectiveness of any regulations resulting from this consultation and consider whether there is a need for a general minimum working age in Yukon.

6. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #831)

THAT this House urges one member of the Official Opposition Caucus, one member of the Third Party Caucus and the Independent Member to accept the Yukon Government's invitation to attend the Climate Leaders Summit at COP15 in Copenhagen, Denmark, as observers from December 13-20, 2009.

7. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #832)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explore the concept of a multidisciplinary approach to dealing with the complex needs of chronic substance abusers.

8. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #887)

THAT the membership of the Members' Services Board, as established by Motion #7 of the First Session of the 32nd Legislative Assembly, be amended by rescinding the appointment of Brad Cathers and appointing the Hon. Glenn Hart to the board.

9. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #888)

THAT the membership of the Standing Committee on Rules, Elections and Privileges, as established by Motion #6 of the First Session of the 32nd Legislative Assembly, be amended by rescinding the appointment of Brad Cathers and appointing John Edzerza to the committee.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Fairclough (Motion #928)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to respect local decision making bodies and their recommendations by providing adequate justification when recommendations from these bodies are rejected.

2. Mr. Fairclough (Motion #929)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support and respect Yukon boards, committees and commissions as a valuable resource to government by explaining why the recommendations from the Yukon Fish and Wildlife Management Board with regards to the two year moratorium on sheep hunting on Pilot Mountain were rejected.

3. Mr. Inverarity (Motion #930)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to declare 2010 the Year of the Yukon Tartan and

- (1) educate Yukoners on the tradition of the Yukon Tartan,
- (2) promote the Yukon Tartan at Yukon social and cultural events,
- (3) feature the Yukon Tartan at the 2010 Olympic Games in Vancouver,
- (4) encourage all MLAs to wear or display the Yukon Tartan at events or gatherings throughout the year; and
- (5) encourage Yukon's cultural industries to host an annual Yukon Tattoo, similar to the Royal Nova Scotia International Tattoo, to showcase our diverse culture and heritage
- 4. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #931)

THAT this House urges the Minister responsible for consumer protections to raise with his federal couterpart in Ottawa, at the earliest possible opportunity, the inadequacy of the proposed voluntary Code of Conduct for companies that issue consumer credit and debit cards, and to press the Government of Canada to bring forward proposals, such as lowering the interest rates and hidden costs related to using credit and debit cards, to assist debt-burdened Canadians.

5. Mr. Hardy (Motion #932)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to introduce legislation in the Legislative Assembly by November 30, 2010, enabling the establishment of credit unions in the Territory.

6. Mr. Hardy (Motion #933)

THAT this House urges on the Government of Canada to address the planet's defining crisis, climate change, through decisive action, including, but not limited to:

- (1) committing to a medium-range target to reduce Canada's greenhouse gas emissions to a level that is 25% below the 1990 level by the year 2020,
- (2) committing to a long-term target to reduce Canada's greenhouse gas emissions to a level that is 80% below the 1990 level by the year 2050,
- (3) reporting frequently to Parliament on the success of proposed measures to meet targets,
- (4) establishing a carbon tax and cap-in-trade system,

- (5) putting a moratorium on any new Tar Sands developments; and
- (6) creating a series of incentive programs to lower fossil fuel consumption.

7. Mr. Cathers (Motion #934)

THAT this House urges the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources and the Department of Environment to continue working together to improve regulatory efficiency and effectiveness, including identifying further opportunities to make operational improvements related to inspections and testing.
