GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

4. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #713)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada and its NATO allies to insist in the strongest possible terms that the Government of Afghanistan fully honour its human rights treaty obligations under international laws and demonstrate its commitment both in law and in practice to respect, protect and enforce the equality rights of the women of Afghanistan or face international sanctions.

5. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #723)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to support the findings of the Motion #542 Consultation Report done by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board, responding to Motion #542 adopted during the 2008 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, by requesting that the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board:

- (1) work together within their existing frameworks of authority to appropriately address areas of general consensus;
- (2) work together to ensure adequate training, orientation and supervision of young workers; and
- (3) conduct a review within 5 years to assess the effectiveness of any regulations resulting from this consultation and consider whether there is a need for a general minimum working age in Yukon.

6. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #832)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explore the concept of a multidisciplinary approach to dealing with the complex needs of chronic substance abusers.

7. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #935)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to meet its obligations under the Yukon First Nation Self-Government Agreements by providing sufficient financial resources to implement these agreements through the Assumption of Responsibilities Agreement (ARA) process; and to demonstrate this commitment by negotiating an appropriate ARA on the administration of justice with the Teslin Tlingit Council.

8. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #941)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to work with Canada's tourism industry, provinces and territories and other stakeholders in the development of China Approved Destination Status policies and processes that will enable Canada's tourism sector to capitalize on this opportunity.

9. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #1007)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to reinstate its funding for the Aboriginal Healing Foundation to ensure that the Kwanlin Dun First Nation, the Liard Aboriginal Women's Society, the Northern Tutchone Tribal Council, and the Committee on Abuse in Residential Schools Society (CAIRS), which have provided services to residential school survivors, can continue their programs.

10. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #1017)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to recognize Yukon Self-Governing First Nations as a senior level of government, by working with the first seven Yukon First Nations

who settled their land claims to develop new Financial Transfer Agreements that include an economic development incentive allowing Yukon First Nations to retain an appropriate percentage of their own source revenues.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Nordick (Motion #1131)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to increase First Nation education funding for on-reserve education to levels comparable with provincial and territorial expenditures.

2. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1132)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to provide stable, predictable, long-term funding for non-governmental organizations in order that they can collectively and individually provide a broad range of important programs and services to the Yukon public.

3. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1133)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to implement the recommendations of the Working Without Boundaries Final Report in order to:

- (1) improve the delivery of frontline services to children and families at risk in the departments of Education, Health and Social Services, and Justice; and
- (2) ensure that the social inclusion strategy is acted upon by all departments in the Yukon Government.

4. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1134)

THAT this House urges the Minister responsible for the Women's Directorate to immediately act upon the documented need for additional second-stage housing for abused women in Whitehorse, by:

- (1) consulting with her colleagues, the Minister of Health and Social Services and the Minister responsible for the Yukon Housing Corporation, on the need for second-stage housing,
- (2) determining the best possible response to the accommodation needed,
- (3) submitting and supporting a recommendation to her Cabinet colleagues on the construction of second-stage housing,
- (4) advertising for a Request for Proposals for the recommended housing; and
- (5) beginning this process at the earliest possible moment.

5. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1135)

THAT it is the opinion of this House that the Government of Canada should address the many troubling and alarming investments of Canadians' retirement dollars that the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board has made into war, environmental abuses and human rights violations around the world by:

- (1) appointment a labour and civil society representative to the CPPIB,
- (2) requiring the CPPIB to adhere to its Socially Responsible Investment policy for proxy voting,
- (3) reviewing the composition of the CPPIB to address and resolve conflicts of interest of current board members,
- (4) introducing legal and ethical screening legislation so that CPPIB investments are in compliance with international and domestic laws, as well as existing treaties; and
- (5) ending the use of the CPP as a tool for privatizing public services in Canada and internationally.

6. Mr. Cathers (Motion #1136)

THAT this House urges the Leader of the Yukon Liberal Party and the Member for Vuntut Gwitchin to publicly explain why they did not agree to grant unanimous consent to debate Motion #1036 standing in the name of the Member for Klondike.
