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ORDERS OF THE DAY

GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

4. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #713)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada and its NATO allies to insist in the strongest possible terms that the Government of Afghanistan fully honour its human rights treaty obligations under international laws and demonstrate its commitment both in law and in practice to respect, protect and enforce the equality rights of the women of Afghanistan or face international sanctions.

5. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #723)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to support the findings of the Motion #542 Consultation Report done by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board, responding to Motion #542 adopted during the 2008 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, by requesting that the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board:

- (1) work together within their existing frameworks of authority to appropriately address areas of general consensus;
- (2) work together to ensure adequate training, orientation and supervision of young workers; and
- (3) conduct a review within 5 years to assess the effectiveness of any regulations resulting from this consultation and consider whether there is a need for a general minimum working age in Yukon.

6. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #832)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explore the concept of a multidisciplinary approach to dealing with the complex needs of chronic substance abusers.

7. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #935)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to meet its obligations under the Yukon First Nation Self-Government Agreements by providing sufficient financial resources to implement these agreements through the Assumption of Responsibilities Agreement (ARA) process; and to demonstrate this commitment by negotiating an appropriate ARA on the administration of justice with the Teslin Tlingit Council.

8. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #941)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to work with Canada's tourism industry, provinces and territories and other stakeholders in the development of China Approved Destination Status policies and processes that will enable Canada's tourism sector to capitalize on this opportunity.

9. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #1007)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to reinstate it's funding for the Aboriginal Healing Foundation to ensure that the Kwanlin Dun First Nation, the Liard Aboriginal Women's Society, the Northern Tutchone Tribal Council, and the Committee on Abuse in Residential Schools Society (CAIRS), which have provided services to residential school survivors, can continue their programs.

10. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #1017)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to recognize Yukon Self-Governing First Nations as a senior level of government, by working with the first seven Yukon First Nations

who settled their land claims to develop new Financial Transfer Agreements that include an economic development incentive allowing Yukon First Nations to retain an appropriate percentage of their own source revenues.

GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #1226)

THAT the terms of reference of the Select Committee on the Safe Operation and Use of Offroad Vehicles, as established by Motion #834 of the 1st session of the 32nd Legislative Assembly, be amended by changing the date of its reporting to the House from the 2010 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly to the 2011 Spring Sitting of the Legislative Assembly.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1227)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support the Canadian Bar Association resolution calling on the federal, provincial and territorial governments of Canada to develop policies designed to assist and enhance the lives of those people born with a permanent organic brain injury which results in a cognitive disorder known as Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder, by:

- (1) allocating additional resources for alternatives to the current practice of criminalizing individuals with FASD, and directing Yukon's Minister of Justice to urge her federal, provincial and territorial counterparts to persuade their respective governments to do the same, and;
- (2) urging the federal, provincial and territorial ministers of justice to engage in a dialogue with the Canadian Bar Association regarding amending criminal sentencing laws to accommodate the disability of those with FASD.

2. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1228)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to convene a Mining Best Practices Summit, prior to the commencement of the 2011 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, to bring together industry, other levels of government and the general public to develop a coordinated and comprehensive response to the increased mining activity in the territory, in order that Yukon can take a planned approach to:

- (1) maximizing socio-economic benefits through modernized royalty and tax regimes and enhanced local employment and training opportunities,
- (2) strengthening Yukon's regulatory regimes, including water quality standards, reclamation policies and other related land-management issues,
- (3) minimizing environmental liabilities by supporting best practices approaches to modern mining technologies; and
- (4) reducing rates of injury and death through strengthening Yukon's occupational health and safety regime as well as increasing our mine rescue preparedness capacity.

3. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #1229)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to grant the City of Whitehorse's request for a temporary mineral staking ban within city limits while the City and its citizens determine which areas are appropriate for mining.
