GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
- (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.

4. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #713)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada and its NATO allies to insist in the strongest possible terms that the Government of Afghanistan fully honour its human rights treaty obligations under international laws and demonstrate its commitment both in law and in practice to respect, protect and enforce the equality rights of the women of Afghanistan or face international sanctions.

5. Hon. Mr. Hart (Motion #723)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to support the findings of the Motion #542 Consultation Report done by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board, responding to Motion #542 adopted during the 2008 Fall Sitting of the Legislative Assembly, by requesting that the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board and the Employment Standards Board:

- (1) work together within their existing frameworks of authority to appropriately address areas of general consensus;
- (2) work together to ensure adequate training, orientation and supervision of young workers; and
- (3) conduct a review within 5 years to assess the effectiveness of any regulations resulting from this consultation and consider whether there is a need for a general minimum working age in Yukon.

6. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #832)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explore the concept of a multidisciplinary approach to dealing with the complex needs of chronic substance abusers.

7. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #935)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to meet its obligations under the Yukon First Nation Self-Government Agreements by providing sufficient financial resources to implement these agreements through the Assumption of Responsibilities Agreement (ARA) process; and to demonstrate this commitment by negotiating an appropriate ARA on the administration of justice with the Teslin Tlingit Council.

8. Hon. Ms. Taylor (Motion #941)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to work with Canada's tourism industry, provinces and territories and other stakeholders in the development of China Approved Destination Status policies and processes that will enable Canada's tourism sector to capitalize on this opportunity.

9. Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #1007)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to reinstate its funding for the Aboriginal Healing Foundation to ensure that the Kwanlin Dun First Nation, the Liard Aboriginal Women's Society, the Northern Tutchone Tribal Council, and the Committee on Abuse in Residential Schools Society (CAIRS), which have provided services to residential school survivors, can continue their programs.

10. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #1017)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to recognize Yukon Self-Governing First Nations as a senior level of government, by working with the first seven Yukon First Nations who settled their land claims to develop new Financial Transfer Agreements that include an

economic development incentive allowing Yukon First Nations to retain an appropriate percentage of their own source revenues.

Hon. Ms. Horne (Motion #1241)

THAT this House supports the Government of Canada's introduction of Bill C-54, Protecting Children from Sexual Predators Act, in order to help protect children from adult sexual predators by establishing mandatory prison sentences for seven existing Criminal Code offences such as luring a child, sexual assault and aggravated assault as well as creating two new offences related to facilitating a sexual offence against a child and using telecommunications, including the Internet, to communicate with another person to agree or make arrangements to commit a sexual offence against a child.

> THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to ensure that Yukon remains one of the best jurisdictions in the world in which to invest by continuing to implement competitive taxation and royalty regimes in order to maintain or reduce industry's cost of doing business in the territory.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Nordick (Motion #1340)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to ensure that Yukoners have access to a standard of health care that is comparable to the standards in other jurisdictions in Canada by:

- encouraging existing medical clinics and practises to expand their services and attract more health care professionals to reside in the territory in order to improve Yukoners' access to family doctors,
- (2) sponsoring the education of Yukon health care and medical professional students and providing incentives for them to return and practise in the territory,
- (3) encouraging visiting health care and medical specialists to offer their services in the territory by providing them with access to appropriate medical facilities including office space and residences such as the new staff residence/health service facility being constructed on Hospital Road,
- (4) establishing regional health care facilities throughout the territory such as the regional hospitals being constructed in Dawson City and Watson Lake in order to provide rural Yukoners with access to an appropriate level of health care,
- (5) utilizing and expanding Telehealth care services throughout the territory; and
- (6) ensuring Yukoners have priority access to health care and medical services in other jurisdictions, primarily Alberta and British Columbia, for services not available in the territory including covering medical travel and other expenses.
- 2. Mr. Nordick (Motion #1341)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to give a status report on the 33 "Actions to be undertaken" contained in the Yukon Government Climate Change Action Plan.

3. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #1342)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to explain conflicting messages coming from the Premier and the Minister of Health and Social Services on the subject of cuts or the introduction of user fees to the medical travel program.

4. Mr. Mitchell (Motion #1343)

THAT this House urges the Premier of Yukon to add his name to the "I Am (Not Stephen Harper's) Canadian" petition and thereby instruct the Prime Minister of Canada that:

- (1) the Government of Canada should immediately cease official reference to itself as the "Harper Government",
- (2) this is not Stephen Harper's government; it is the government of the Canadian people,
- (3) our country is not Stephen Harper's Canada; it is a democratic Canada,
- (4) we are not Stephen Harper's Canadians; we are Canadian; and
- (5) we request that all official references to the Canadian government continue to use "Government of Canada".

5. Ms. Hanson (Motion #1344)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to consult stakeholders on developing and expanding innovative scholarships, grants and loan programs to address financial obstacles to post-secondary education for low and middle income students, in order to:

- (1) decrease the debt load of students,
- (2) allow part-time students access to grants and loans,
- (3) increase the number of rural and single parent post-secondary students,
- (4) encourage the Federal Government to innovate their post-secondary programs by shifting spending from universal expenditures on tax credits and savings schemes to needbased grants,
- (5) eliminate the financial barriers to education for capable students; and
- (6) invest in future Yukon knowledge-based accomplishments by investing in our students.

6. Ms. Hanson (Motion #1345)

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to support Bill C-393, An Act to Amend the Patent Act (drugs for international humanitarian purposes) and to make a consequential amendment to another Act, standing in the name of New Democratic Party Member of Parliament Paul Dewar (Ottawa Centre).
