GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #25)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support development of the agriculture sector with actions including:

- (1) working with farmers and industry associations including Yukon Agriculture Association and the Grower's of Organic Food Yukon to implement the Agriculture Multi-Year Development Plan,
- (2) developing a "Yukon-Grown Food Policy" aimed at significantly increasing the production and use of locally-grown vegetables, meat and food products,
- (3) supporting the development of agriculture infrastructure that improves food security, facilitates access to market, and encourages local production of food,
- (4) supporting the development of local markets for Yukon agriculture products through measures including increasing the annual funding for the Fireweed Community Market; and
- (5) working with Yukon farmers to conduct agricultural research.
- 2. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #46)

THAT, the Standing Orders of the Yukon Legislative Assembly be amended by adding the following standing order:

76(7) The provisions of this Standing Order shall apply to an interim supply appropriation bill on the final sitting day prior to the end of the fiscal year in which the bill is introduced.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Ms. McLeod (Motion #47)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support the use of natural gas as an alternative to burning diesel fuel for electrical power production.

2. Ms. McLeod (Motion #48)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to develop the additional oil and gas regulations needed to manage and facilitate responsible development and use of the Yukon's oil and gas resources.

3. Ms. Stick (Motion #49)

THAT it is the opinion of this House that the Yukon Government should make every effort to include persons with disabilities in its workforce by ensuring the principles of the <u>United Nations' Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities</u> are followed, through:

- (1) non-discrimination,
- (2) full and effective participation and inclusion,
- (3) respect for difference and acceptance as part of human diversity and humanity,
- (4) equality of opportunity,
- (5) accessibility; and
- (6) equality between men and women.
- 4. Ms. Moorcroft (Motion #50)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to implement the recommendations of the Select Committee on Amendments to the *Human Rights Act* tabled in the House in 2010.

5. Ms. Moorcroft (Motion #51)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to review all Yukon acts with a view to including in them the rights of persons in same sex marriages in order to be in full compliance with the Yukon *Human Rights Act*.

6. Mr. Barr (Motion #52)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to work with Canada Post Corporation to ensure that Tagish, Yukon, has a local post office and mail boxes.

7. Mr. Elias (Motion #53)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work with the governments of Canada and the United States, and any agencies or industries involved in the development and implementation of safety standards for oil and gas drilling in the Beaufort Sea, to ensure safeguards and contingency plans for spills are in place for all future oil and gas exploration and development.

8. Mr. Elias (Motion #54)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to undertake a review of its secondary school students' travel subsidy.

9. Mr. Elias (Motion #55)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to begin a client service assessment to determine the level of care required for our elders in Old Crow including infrastructure requirements, staffing levels, access to health services and the availability of the services that are enjoyed by other Yukon seniors and elders.

10. Mr. Elias (Motion #56)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work with the Government of the Northwest Territories, interested First Nation governments, and the Government of Canada to develop a strategy for upgrading and reconstructing sections of the Dempster Highway.
