THAT this House urges Air Canada and West Jet, in pursuing their competitive corporate objectives in Yukon, to ensure that the on-going viability of Air North is not compromised, and to negotiate interline and code-share agreements with Air North.

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to strengthen and diversify Yukon's economy by investing in the research, innovation, and commercialization of cold climate technology.

MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS

1. Mr. Hassard (Motion #92)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to continue to follow the land use planning process set out in Chapter 11 of the <u>Umbrella Final Agreement</u> to complete the Peel Watershed Regional Land Use Plan.

2. Ms. McLeod (Motion #93)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support fish, wildlife, and habitat management and planning by conducting inventory projects throughout Yukon.

3. Ms. Stick (Motion #94)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Health and Social Services to:

- (1) immediately begin an in-depth evaluation of Yukon's Substance Abuse Action Plan and all Yukon Government services for alcohol, drugs, and gambling addictions,
- (2) review similar programs in Western Canada with a view to determining their adequacy and the need for implementing new programs, in the following areas:
 - (a) medical and housing support for substance detoxification,
 - (b) professional and volunteer group and one-on-one counselling,
 - (c) residential treatment options including land-based facilities,
 - (d) supportive aftercare services particularly in rural Yukon,
 - (e) preventative programs especially for children and youth,
 - (f) special needs clients such as persons affected by FASD,
 - (g) harm reduction counselling and projects, and
 - (h) pilot projects of innovative detoxification, treatment, and aftercare options;

and

- (3) establish a Yukon addictions strategy within the 2012-13 fiscal year.
- 4. Mr. Tredger (Motion #95)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to respond to the housing crisis looming for seniors and elders in rural Yukon by developing a comprehensive seniors' and elders' housing strategy through:

- (1) consulting with all stakeholders to determine a continuum of care,
- (2) assuring that rural seniors and elders do not have to leave their home communities; and
- (3) completing this investigation by September, 2012.
- 5. Mr. Elias (Motion #96)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Environment to verify with the federal ministers of Environment, and Fisheries and Oceans that salmon and other fish stocks, migratory waterfowl, and ocean mammals have not been contaminated by Japan's Fukushima Daiichi nuclear reactor meltdown and that they, accordingly, are safe for Canadians to consume.

6. Mr. Silver (Motion #97)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to immediately take steps to invest in affordable housing projects in the territory, by using the remaining \$13 million in funding that it received from the federal government years ago to develop affordable housing in the territory, which the Yukon Government continues to claim as savings.
