1. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #25)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to support development of the agriculture sector with actions including:

- (1) working with farmers and industry associations including Yukon Agriculture Association and the Grower's of Organic Food Yukon to implement the Agriculture Multi-Year Development Plan,
- (2) developing a "Yukon-Grown Food Policy" aimed at significantly increasing the production and use of locally-grown vegetables, meat and food products,
- (3) supporting the development of agriculture infrastructure that improves food security, facilitates access to market, and encourages local production of food,
- (4) supporting the development of local markets for Yukon agriculture products through measures including increasing the annual funding for the Fireweed Community Market; and
- (5) working with Yukon farmers to conduct agricultural research.

2. Hon. Mr. Dixon (Motion #119)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to develop and implement a Yukon Water Strategy that will help provide long-term direction for economically and environmentally responsible development, management, and use of water in Yukon and establish principles to guide future decision making.

## 1. Mr. Tredger (Motion #173)

THAT the Chair of the Standing Committee on Rules, Elections and Privileges shall convene a meeting prior to the end of the 2012 Spring Sitting for the purpose of bringing forward recommendations on:

- (1) the use of electronic devices in the Chamber; and
- (2) permitting the presentation of e-petitions, in order to modernize the practices of the Legislative Assembly.

## 2. Ms. White (Motion #174)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to act on its promise made during the 2011 election to introduce legislation to manage ATVs in the Yukon wilderness by:

- (1) forming a technical committee, comprised of government employees and interest groups to draft legislation governing the use of off-road vehicles; and
- (2) immediately undertaking an educational campaign which focuses on both environmental stewardship of sensitive alpine and wetlands areas, and on the safe, responsible and respectful operation of off-road vehicles by all users in Yukon.

## 3. Mr. Barr (Motion #175)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to develop and introduce a Homeowner Protection Act that includes mandatory licencing for home builders and contractors and an effective warranty program for new home construction and home renovations.

## 4. Mr. Silver (Motion #176)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Education to work with the Minister of Health and Social Services to facilitate the sharing of the names of incoming kindergarten-age children, drawn from community health records, with Dawson City kindergarten teachers, in order that those teachers may better engage with and prepare those families for entering the school system.
