  - (1) whether this project is included in the 2017-2018 budget;
  - (2) full results of consultation that took place recently on this initiative;
  - (3) whether this project is subject to a YESAA assessment;
    - (a) if so, when will it be submitted;
  - (4) whether there are measures included for a service road on the west side of the highway near the post office boxes; and
  - (5) what plans are in place for pedestrian crossings?
