Hon. Mr. Silver, Premier

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to practice sound financial management by:

- (1) recognizing the importance of including full future O&M costs when making new capital investments;
- (2) engaging with Yukoners to ensure that they have a say in deciding how to address current and future budget shortfalls;
- (3) reporting regularly to Yukoners on the financial health of the territory by way of economic outlooks and public accounts;
- (4) integrating fiscal forecasting with budget planning to improve accuracy of O&M and capital budgets; and
- (5) developing a predictable five-year capital plan.

#### 1. Motion No. 290

Ms. Hanson, Leader of the Official Opposition

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to engage with the Yukon Child Care Board, pursuant to their function set out in section 4(4) of the *Child Care Act*, to develop and implement a Yukon early childhood strategy based on the principles of universality, high quality and comprehensiveness, which includes:

- (1) public plans for developing integrated systems of early learning and childcare that meet the care and early education needs of children, their parents and caregivers;
- (2) public funding delivered directly to early learning and childcare services and systems; and
- (3) public management of the expansion of public and not-for-profit early learning and childcare services under public authorities, including integration of existing community services into publicly managed systems; and

THAT the Yukon Child Care Board be mandated and resourced to carry out consultation on these matters with First Nation and municipal governments, parents and caregivers of young children, and early childhood, education and health care professionals.

#### 2. Motion No. 291

Ms. Hanson, Leader of the Official Opposition

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to review the penalties for infractions made pursuant to the *Territorial Lands (Yukon) Act*, and consider increasing them in order to reflect the seriousness and actual costs of damage done by infractions and to act as a real deterrent to ignoring the law.

#### 3. Motion No. 292

Mr. Istchenko, Member for Kluane

THAT this House urges the Government of Canada to:

- (1) recognize that Bill C-71, An Act to amend certain Acts and Regulations in relation to firearms, will negatively impact lawful gun owners in Yukon;
- (2) commit to remove all provisions in Bill C-71 that create a new long-gun registry;
- (3) meaningfully consult with all Yukoners before the passage of any legislation that affects Yukon gun owners; and
- (4) provide more resources to police forces to focus gun control efforts on criminals and gangs instead of on lawful gun owners.

#### 4. Motion No. 293

Mr. Cathers, Member for Lake Laberge

THAT this House urges the Yukon government to oppose Bill C-71, An Act to amend certain Acts and Regulations in relation to firearms, in order to protect law-abiding Canadian firearms owners and prevent the backdoor establishment of a long-gun registry.

#### 5. Motion No. 294

Ms. White, Member for Takhini-Kopper King

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to respond to the presence of plastics in Earth's oceans, fresh water and environment by working with industry and municipal and First Nation governments to:

- (1) eliminate the distribution of single-use plastic bags;
- (2) eliminate the use of single-use plastic food and beverage containers including straws, utensils and lids; and
- (3) reduce the amount of plastic packaging throughout the retail industry.
