Will the Minister of Community Services please provide the following information regarding Yukon Emergency Medical Services (YEMS):

(1) the number of people currently employed as auxiliary-on-call paramedics;

- (2) the number of auxiliary-on-call paramedics who have been serving in this capacity for more than one year;
- (3) the number of full-time positions in YEMS which have been filled in the past two years by hiring someone from outside of Yukon;
- (4) the number of full-time positions in YEMS that have been filled in the past two years by hiring someone from outside of Yukon, which people who were already employed by YEMS as auxiliary-on-call paramedics also applied for;
- (5) the number of paramedics employed as auxiliary-on-call who have unsuccessfully applied for a full-time position that was given to a non-resident of Yukon in the past two years;
- (6) the number of paramedics from Outside with less than one year of job experience post-graduation who were offered full-time positions in the last two years;
- (7) a monthly breakdown of the number of people who have left a position with YEMS as an auxiliary-on-call paramedic in the last two years;
