## 1. Written Question No. 30 (October 31, 2018)

Mr. Cathers, Member for Lake Laberge

Addressed to the Hon. Mr. Streicker, Minister of Community Services

Will the Minister of Community Services please provide the following information regarding Yukon Emergency Medical Services (YEMS):

- (1) the number of people currently employed as auxiliary-on-call paramedics;
- (2) the number of auxiliary-on-call paramedics who have been serving in this capacity for more than one year;
- (3) the number of full-time positions in YEMS which have been filled in the past two years by hiring someone from outside of Yukon;
- (4) the number of full-time positions in YEMS that have been filled in the past two years by hiring someone from outside of Yukon, which people who were already employed by YEMS as auxiliary-on-call paramedics also applied for;
- (5) the number of paramedics employed as auxiliary-on-call who have unsuccessfully applied for a full-time position that was given to a non-resident of Yukon in the past two years;
- (6) the number of paramedics from Outside with less than one year of job experience post-graduation who were offered full-time positions in the last two years;
- (7) a monthly breakdown of the number of people who have left a position with YEMS as an auxiliary-on-call paramedic in the last two years;
- (8) information regarding the amount of notice that is provided to auxiliary-on-call paramedics about their schedule, including whether or not the amount of notice has been reduced;
- (9) information regarding why it is more difficult for YEMS volunteers to get Naloxone kits than it is for the general public;
- (10) the number of current YEMS volunteers in each community; and
- (11) the policy on allowing YEMS volunteers to do “ride alongs” with paramedics to gain more experience in dealing with health emergencies?

## 2. Written Question No. 31 (November 6, 2018)
