Addressed to the Hon. Mr. Clarke, Minister of Highways and Public Works

Regarding two data breaches in the last two months in different departments:

- (1) what is the number of data breaches within Yukon government since November 8, 2016;
- (2) how many Yukon government employees have received *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (ATIPP) training since 2016;
- (3) how frequently do new Yukon government employees receive ATIPP training;
- (4) how many current Yukon government employees have up-to-date ATIPP training;
- (5) moving forward, are there plans to increase the amount of ATIPP training for all public servants; and
- (6) will the government increase resources dedicated to ATIPP?
